PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Friends

It would be an understatement to say that National leadership has dominated conversation and news in recent days. On the international front we have had constant reaction and opinion about the US election and the merits and demerits of each of the candidates.

At home here in SA we have had more than our fair share of exposure to headlines, overload on social media and probably far too many conversations in our homes and amongst our friends.

Internationally and locally much of the conversation has been critical in nature. We are concerned about the quality of leadership on offer on the world stage as well as in our own backyard.

The flaws we are concerned about include: lack of integrity, corruption, self-enrichment, exploitation of the poor, state capture, lack of courage, inefficiency, arrogance, nepotism, poor service delivery, dishonesty, injustice, laziness, disregard for the rule of law... the list probably can be extended to many other concerns.

How do we Christians respond to this situation?

We must pray for those in authority (1 Timothy 2v1-3); we must be subject to the governing authorities. For there is no authority except from God (Romans 13:1); like John the Baptist we must courageously speak out against all evil and unrighteousness (John 14v4); we must live

as those who know that our citizenship is not on earth but in heaven (Philippians 3v20); like Jesus we need to run with endurance the race set before us, looking to Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God (Hebrews 12:2).

These and more are responses we must give ourselves to as we seek to live lives that are worthy of our Lord.

There is one response that has been weighing heavily on me in recent days that I would like to elaborate on. It is doing what Jesus challenged the Pharisees to do in *Matthew 7:3:*

Why do you see the speck that is in your brother's eye, but do not notice the log that is in your own eye? ⁴Or how can you say to your brother, 'Let me take the speck out of your eye,' when there is the log in your own eye? ⁵You hypocrite, first take the log out of your own eye, and then you will see clearly to take the speck out of your brother's eye.

It is the response of personal holiness.

In every instance of criticism I (we) must have the courage to look at ourselves, our family and our church to see if we are not being blinded by "a log of sin" in our own eyes; in this way grieving the Spirit of God and thus keeping us from pleasing the Lord.

examples include; criticising Some may government leaders of corruption and yet not paying Caesar what is due to Caesar or refusing to pay etolls; having a lot to say (and rightly so) about those who support abortion and yet having no concern for thousands of orphans on our doorstep; hating the way taxi drivers behave on the streets and pavements of our country and yet disregarding traffic laws ourselves; despising the widespread corruption and yet slipping a R100 note to a traffic officer; critical of sex offenders and promiscuous society and yet never taking a minute to share the gospel with anyone; complaining about arrogant leaders and yet think ourselves better than others...

It is a wonderful blessing to be a recipient of the grace of God. But as those who have had a debt of sin cancelled and our status changes to children of God we need to pursue holy living.

May our Lord continue to sanctify each one of us

to the glory of His name. As you celebrate and reflect on the meaning of Christmas this year will you along with me consider how we can spur one another on in love and good deeds? Let us live and walk as Jesus did.

2 Peter 3:10: But the day of the Lord will come like a thief, and then the heavens will pass away with a roar, and the heavenly bodies will be burned up and dissolved, and the earth and the works that are done on it will be exposed. ¹¹Since all these things are thus to be dissolved, what sort of people ought you to be in lives of holiness and godliness, ¹²waiting for and hastening the coming of the day of God, because of which the heavens will be set on fire and dissolved, and the heavenly bodies will melt as they burn! ¹³But according to his promise we are waiting for new heavens and a new earth in which righteousness dwells.

Our hope must be in God and not in men.







Thomas Kelly was an Irishman through and through, from Kellywatle, Ireland. He studied to be a lawyer like his father, but in the process began to read Christian doctrine. Under conviction of sin, he struggled to find peace with God through fasting and asceticism, but it didn't work. Eventually, he trusted Jesus Christ for the free gift of salvation through faith. He was ordained a minister in the established church, but because of his strong views on salvation by

grace, he moved on to serve in independent chapels. It is said that most of his hymns were focused on Jesus Christ, praising Him for His work on the cross and the glories of heaven. In a way, Kelly writes simply, and yet because his rhyme schemes are unusual, the words become more memorable. This hymn is typical of Kelly, beginning with grateful praise to his Saviour and ending with a meditation on heaven. Fom *Great Songs of Faith* by Brown & Norton.





"I've asked for a new pram for my doll." added Minnie the Miggie.


"You are very silent, Billy." said Andy to Billy the Bee. "Don't bees get Christmas presents?"

so grateful that I have been whistling ever since."


